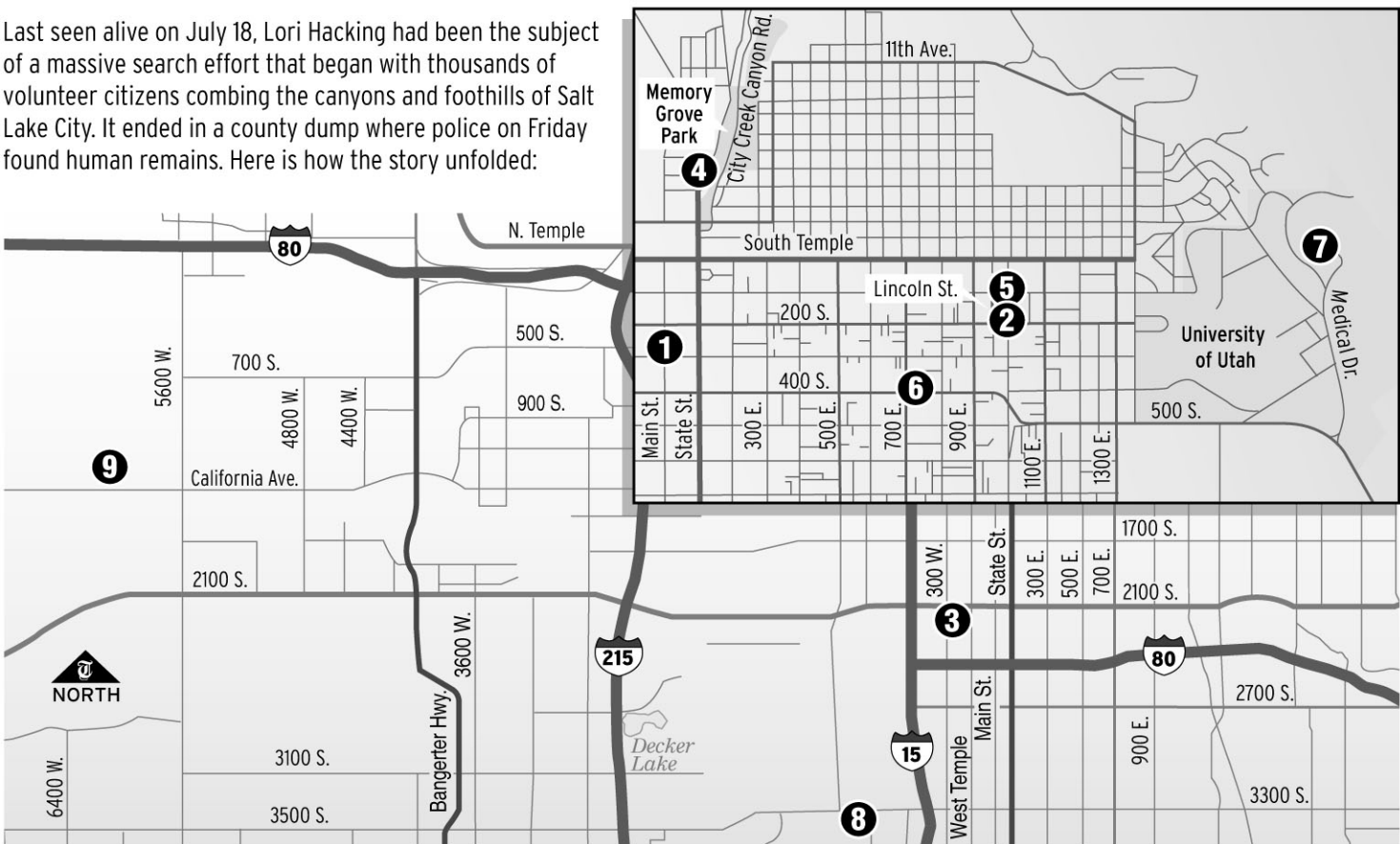


# The search for Lori Hacking comes to an end

Last seen alive on July 18, Lori Hacking had been the subject of a massive search effort that began with thousands of volunteer citizens combing the canyons and foothills of Salt Lake City. It ended in a county dump where police on Friday found human remains. Here is how the story unfolded:



**1. Wells Fargo, 299 S. Main St.:** Co-workers on July 16 observe a visibly upset Lori Hacking talking on the phone, presumably to the University of North Carolina, regarding her husband's enrollment status. She leaves work early.



**2. The Hackings' apartment, 127 S. Lincoln St. (945 East):** Police believe Lori was killed here in the early morning hours of July 18. Police later recover small amounts of blood, a knife, a box spring and several bags of evidence.

**3. Bradley's Sleep Etc. store, 2255 S. 300 West:** Mark Hacking purchases a mattress with his credit card at 10:23 a.m. on July 19.



**4. City Creek Canyon and Memory Grove Park:** Mark Hacking says he found his wife's car here the morning of July 19 and ran her usual jogging route twice before reporting her missing to police at 10:49 a.m. An intensive search involving thousands of volunteers centers on the canyon for about a week.

**5. LDS church, 951 E. 100 South:** From a trash bin here, police seize a mattress as evidence July 19.

**6. Chase Suite Hotel, 765 E. 400 South:** A near-naked Mark Hacking reportedly causes a disturbance here in the early morning hours of July 20.

**7. University Hospital:** Mark Hacking is admitted to the hospital's psychiatric ward July 20 after causing a disturbance near a hotel. Police arrest him Monday as he is discharged from the hospital.

**8. Salt Lake County Jail, 3415 S. 900 West:** On Aug. 2, two weeks after he reports his wife missing, Mark Hacking is booked into jail on suspicion of murder. He is later charged with first-degree felony murder. An arraignment is scheduled for Oct. 29.



**9. The Salt Lake County Landfill, 6030 W. California Ave. (1300 South):** Shortly after she was reported missing, police and cadaver dogs searched the county dump for Lori Hacking's body. On Friday, police discover human remains, which later in the day are positively identified as hers.
